- The committee reviewed revisions of APS 5002—Faculty Appointment Letters and APS 1021—Faculty Mentoring and provided the following comments to the FAEC.
 - For APS 1021 Faculty Mentoring, several committee members expressed disappointment that NTT faculty were only mentioned briefly and then only regarding faculty development opportunities.
 - Mentoring is important for NTT as well as TT.
 - Faculty development opportunities could be used as a means of keeping promising NTT faculty at the university so the focus on long-serving NTTF seems misplaced.
