This month the EPUS committee has provided feedback to the campus administration on creating a new policy and procedures for implementation. The policy is pretty straight forward. It is trying to accommodate some new federal guidelines now required for certificate programs by creating a new policy. It also seems like an attempt to get some consistency in how certificates are awarded.

New Policy

- 200-023 Certificate Programs
- 200-023 Standards and Procedures for Certificate Programs

The EPUS committee made some minor suggestions and some suggested some clarifications. A final version of this policy should be returned to EPUS shortly. I anticipate a final version of the policy will be available for review of the Faculty Assembly at our next meeting.

As chair, I am seeking some clarification of the processes for approving or modifying campus policies. Some practices followed in the recent past may not have conformed to procedures required by the campus and CU system Faculty Constitutions. These practices have been lost through gaps in institutional memory, not through any bad intent of anyone. I have summarized the appropriate rules for in an attempt to align our policy procedures to align with the required processes and forwarded them to the campus admistration.
