## 1. Working group updates

- 1. Academic Research Group
  - a. Workshop Idea for Spring focused around UN Sustainability Goals
    - i. Faculty could bring courses they want to update or integrate new ideas into
    - ii. Workshop proposed for April, around Earth Day
    - iii. Tables themed around each UN goal
    - iv. Kimberly will look at Berger Hall to see if we can book space for Workshop
    - v. Members of the committee: please let us know what classes you teach that already hit on the UN goals (Joel will send out a separate call to committee members for class listings)
    - vi. Also, collapse some goals for workshop to reduce number of tables
  - b. Discussion of GPS class or COMPASS curriculum flagged Humanities course focused around UN goals (Arielle Cassiday)
    - i. Carole recommends she speak with Andrea Herrera about possibility of Humanities course
    - ii. Could also work as a co-taught Health Sciences course; Joel will recommend that that Arielle speak with Nanna about this possibility
    - iii. Course could also be flagged for Global Inclusiveness

  - a. Look at STARS report
  - b. Does the campus need to conduct an assessment of campus culture of sustainability?
    - i. Cerian Gibbes just got a grant to conduct such an assessment/speaking with Linda about this
  - c. Signage around campus to raise awareness
    - i. Especially at ENT center
  - d. Monthly sustainability communication, each focused on a specific theme for education
    - i. Perhaps GAF grant to help with branding/marketing campaign?
  - e. Encourage engagement with local community through Education and Business because they have most links with local campus; internships, etc.
  - f. Climate Change
    - i. Generate a larger conversation around climate change within CU community
    - ii. Reaffirm divestment/we are still in campaign
    - iii. Two SEAS students spoke with regents about this, but they weren't receptive to divestment initiative
  - g. Work with campus clubs to help them in their engagement/advocacy efforts, for instance, MOSAIC
  - h. Brandon Bishop is joining the Engagement/Advocacy Group
