Sustainability Committee Meeting February 26, 2018

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Minutes

- 1. STARS report (Sustainability Tracking Assessment and Rating System)
 - a. Submitted recently for review to AASHE, increased academic research credits and adding it to digital measures was a great success! The overall report score shows 75 points, which indicates gold (65-85 points), which is higher than the previous score (65.5). And, this score is higher than CU Boulder's score. Final score will be announced when evaluation by AASHE is complete. The STARS report includes all operations, academics and research, engagement, affordability, wellness, diversity, and investments. UCCS can be proud with such an accomplishment over a relatively short period of time.
- 2. Library Guide Update

- 3. Sustainability Office Update and Position Funding Request
 - a. Staffing reduction in the office has forced a reduction in activities, initiatives and events, including Sustainnovate, Green Labs, Greening of the Office, Campus Conservation Nationals, fewer zero waste initiatives, Mt. Trashmore, and some of the Pedal Perks Programs.
 - i. Due to this shortage on staff and project coordinator Julie Galusky's departure, Sustainability Office proposes a new hire to return to 3 FTEs in the office. New hire would focus on both office activities and academic/extracurricular projects. Letter was sent in support of this new position to Chancellor Reddy and Provost Tom Christensen.
 - b. The Green Action Fund is up for renewal. We hope for positive news such that this program can continue.
 - c. Metro Bus ridership is steady at about 1000 riders per week. More riders are wanted. There is a referendum to change the language of the Safety and Transportation Fee from 1998 to be able to include paying for the Metro Bus College Pass. If this does not pass, the bus pass will go away.
 - d. ENT center and Village at Alpine Valley received LEED Gold
 - e. Search for Operations Engineer is under way. This hire will help alleviate some of the energy efficiency and new building design work.
 - f. Office of Sustainability has recalculated local food procurement on campus. The 18% local food on campus shows a lower figure of 10%. A large part of this local food percentage is comprised of beer and wine.
